## September 2011 BNB<sup>1</sup>

The cost of the BNB for Harare has continued to increase: from \$505.88 in July 2011 to \$543.69 by end of September 2011. During presentation of the mid-term fiscal review in July, the Minister of Finance announced the re-introduction of import duty on selected food items. This has forced retailers to also increase the prices of imported food items. On average, 2ltrs of D'lite cooking oil was \$3.85 in July and the same item now costs \$4.60 on average. During the same period, the price of imported green bar washing soap has surged from \$1.50 to \$1.77. Unfortunately the prices of locally produced food and non-food items are beyond the reach of many. As **Table 1** presents, the per/kg cost of vegetables (greens, tomatoes and onions) is slightly lower than it was two months ago mainly because these items are now in season.

The Zimbabwe Electricity Supply Authority (ZESA) has also announced a 31% increase in electricity tariffs with effect from September 1, 2011. This has further pushed up the cost of living for ordinary families in Zimbabwe. A family of five, utilizing an average of 600KW per month has to fork out \$73.50 in electricity bills.

**Table 2** compares the BNB for the 10 data collection sites in Harare. **Figures 1** presents a trend analysis of the BNB from November 2010 to September 2011.


